CAYMAN AUTOMOTIVE SUPPORTS GUYANA GREEN ENERGY INITIATIVE:

ELECTRICITY-DRIVEN NISSAN MOTOR VEHICLE TO BE DELIVERED TO THE GUYANA EMBASSY IN CUBA

Cayman Automotive will be pursuing an initiative aimed at supporting President David Granger's Green Economy Program, which has been articulated and is being implemented in the Cooperative Republic of Guyana.

At the invitation of the Founder of the Guyana Foundation, Supriya Singh Bodden, John Felder, Chief Executive Officer of Cayman Automotive, visited Cuba. He held discussions with Mr. Halim Majeed, Guyana's Ambassador in the Republic of Cuba, who explained that green energy constitutes one of the principal foundations of President David Granger's strategy to revitalize and strengthen Guyana's economy by making it less dependent on fossil fuel, the cost of which has always been a financial burden to development of the national economy.

In their further exchange of views, Ambassador Majeed pointed out that "Guyana intends to develop a Green Development Plan which would comprise elements of clean energy supply, the protection of our bio-diversity, and development of eco-tourism, among other things".

Mr. Felder explained that his company has been looking carefully at the approaches that Guyana and Cuba have been taking in terms of facilitating green energy development and he is concretizing plans to export Electricity-driven vehicles to both Guyana and Cuba. As a first step in that direction, Mr. Felder will be delivering a Nissan Leaf and a Clipper Creek- Level 2 Fast Charger to the Guyana Embassy in the Republic of Cuba.

Mr. Felder has been meeting with various representatives of the Cuban Government for some time now and Cayman Automotive is expected to begin the export of electricity-driven vehicles shortly to Cuba. He is expected to travel to Guyana to also begin discussions with the Government of Guyana and the Guyana Private Sector.
